Big Change at The Royal Exchange



The interiors of the building have undergone a major refurbishment with new staircases, mezzanine areas and new retailers, whilst retaining many of the long standing luxury brand outlets.

The redevelopment sees the arrival of Fortnum & Mason. The heritage retailer will occupy two prominent positions at The Royal Exchange with over 2000 square feet of retail space carrying a wide range of products including its most popular teas, preserves and hampers alongside a confectionary counter and fresh produce.

There will also be new dining and bar area in the Courtyard with up to 90 covers, also managed by Fortnum and Mason.

Cornhill Councilman Peter Dunphy who sits on the City's Planning Committee and is also Chairman of the Licensing Committee welcomed the development "The refurbishment of the interior has been very sensitive to one of the most important historic buildings in the City with original features preserved and it is also great to see the famous Fortnum and Mason choose the Royal Exchange for its City flagship."
