A circular walk across uneven ground which explores the newly-planted forest of Gifford Wood and the Buffer Lands of Oxleys and Potkiln Woods.

Start point:

Sergeant's Green Lane

Approximately 1 hour

Distance:

1.25 miles / 2 km
