Notice of Making: Amendments to the one-way restriction Order and Order for road closure (no motor vehicles) at Widegate Street.

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the Common Council of the City of London Corporation has made two Orders under sections 6, 122 and 124 of, and Parts III and IV of Schedule 9 to, the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 (as amended) and section 8 of, and Part I of Schedule 5 to, the Local Government Act 1985 and all other enabling powers as follows:

1. The following Order will come into operation on 24th August 2023 and will be cited as: The City of London (One Way Streets) (Amendment No. 22) (Widegate Street) Order 2023 by amending The City of London (One Way Streets) Traffic Order 2015 ("2015 Order"). The effect of the Order will be to prohibit vehicles travelling along Widegate Street from east to west.

AND

2. The following Order will come into operation on 24th August 2023 and will be cited as: The City of London (Prescribed Routes) (Road Closure) (Amendment No. 24) (Widegate Street) Order 2023 by amending The City of London (Prescribed Routes) (Road Closures) (No. 1) Order 2016 ("2016 Order"). The effect of the Order will be to prohibit vehicles from using the entire length of Widegate Street in the City of London operating between 11.30am and 9.00pm Mondays to Sundays inclusive.

Copies of the Orders, which will come into operation on 24th August 2023, the 2015 Order, the 2016 Order, the statement of reasons for making the Orders and plans showing the affected street can be inspected during normal office hours on Monday to Fridays inclusive for a period of six weeks from the date on which the Orders were made at the Planning Enquiry Desk, North Wing, Guildhall, London, EC2V 7HH and on the City of London website at www.cityoflondon.gov.uk. Any person desiring to question the validity of the Orders or of any provisions contained therein on the grounds that it is not within the powers of the relevant section of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, or that any of the relevant requirements thereof or of any relevant regulations made thereunder has not been complied with may, within six weeks from the date on which the Orders were made, make an application for the purpose to the High Court.
