

TRAFFIC MANAGEMENT ORDER

2023 No. 18

The City of London (One Way Streets) (Amendment No. 22) (Widegate Street) Order 2023

Made: 9th August 2023

Coming into operation: 24th August 2023

The Common Council of the City of London Corporation, after consulting the Commissioner of Police for the City of London, in exercise of the powers conferred by sections 6, 122 and 124 of, and Parts III and IV of Schedule 9 to, the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 (as amended) and of all other powers thereunto enabling hereby make the following Order:-

- 1. This Order may be cited as The City of London (One Way Street) (Amendment No. 22) (Widegate Street) Order 2023 and shall come into operation on 24th August 2023.
- 2. In this Order, "enactment" means any enactment, whether public general or local, and includes any order, byelaw, rule, regulation, scheme or other instrument, having effect by virtue of an enactment and any reference in this Order to any enactment shall be construed as a reference to that enactment as amended, applied, consolidated, reenacted by or as having effect by of any subsequent enactment.
- 3. Without prejudice to the validity of anything done or to any liability incurred in respect of any act or omission before the coming into operation of this Order, The City of London (One Way Street) Traffic Order 2015 shall have effect as though:-
 - (a) for the item in Schedule 1 to that 2015 Order numbered 52 there shall be substituted the item similarly numbered 52 and set out in Schedule 1 to this Order.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This Note is not part of the Order, but is intended to indicate its general purport).

The City of London Corporation is to complete an administration exercise to rectify an error with the one-way traffic restriction on Widegate Street. This will formalise the one-way working which prohibits vehicles from travelling along Widegate Street from east to west.
