

- Chancery Lane Station
 Start of the walk
- St. Etheldreda's, Ely Place
 Historic medieval church, once
 part of Cambridgeshire
- Christchurch Greyfriars
 A garden in a ruined Wren church.
 End of the walk

- Staple Inn
 Former medieval Inn of Court,
 where lawyers trained
- St. Andrew's Holborn
 Resting place of Captain Coram,
 founder of children's charity
- 88-90 Hatton Garden
 Scene of daring Bank Holiday heist
- Holborn Viaduct
 One of the first modern flyovers, opened by Queen Victoria
- The Old Mitre, Ely Court
 Historic pub where Elizabeth I
 danced round the cherry tree
- The Old Bailey
 Central Criminal Court, scene of famous trials
