Escape the crowds of your local neighbourhood and adventure close to home walking in the City of London. Take lesser-trodden paths and uncover centuries of history, art and culture along the way on these walks designed to offer safe and fun ways for you to enjoy and explore London.

When you reach the City there is plenty to explore in the ancient heart of the capital. You don't need to travel to Italy to see Roman ruins or France to experience cafe culture. Grab a coffee in Bloomberg Arcade and watch the world go by, or marvel at the remains of the Roman Amphitheatre under Guildhall Yard.

Lambeth to the City - Doing the Lambeth Walks!

Travel through the centuries between The Garden Museum and Blackfriars

- 1 **Lambeth Palace**
Start of the walk. Official London residence of Archbishops of Canterbury for 800 years
- 2 **Newport Street Gallery**
Former scenery painting studios. Opened in 2015 by Damien Hurst
- 3 **Lambeth Walk**
Once notable for its street market. Famous song from *Me and My Girl*: 'Any time you're Lambeth way, Any evening, any day, You'll find us all, Doin' the Lambeth Walk, Oil'
- 4 **Pelham Mission Hall**
Red brick and stone survivor from 1910. Spot the outside pulpit, where preachers once addressed shoppers. Murals to Charlie Chaplin
- 5 **Morley College**
Adult education college founded 1889: the first to admit men and women on an equal footing
- 6 **Old Vic Theatre**
Opened 1818 at the Coburg Theatre. Rebuilt, renamed, then transformed by Lilian Baylis. Temporary home of the National Theatre. First performance was *Hamlet*, starring Peter O'Toole and directed by Sir Laurence Olivier
- 7 **Paris Garden**
Near here were the Paris Gardens, where bear-baiting took place in the 16th century
- 8 **Black Friar pub**
Victorian pub, built in the 1870s, with a stunning Arts and Crafts interior. Named after the Dominicans, who wore black habits and established a monastery nearby. End of the walk

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The City to Lambeth - Doing the Lambeth Walks!

Travel through the centuries between Blackfriars and The Garden Museum

- 1 Black Friar pub
Start of the walk
- 2 Doggett's Coat and Badge
Modern pub named after the oldest commemorative race in the world
- 3 Christ Church Churchyard
Original church dates from 1670. Rebuilt in 1738 but destroyed in 1941
- 4 Young Vic Theatre
Celebrating 50 years in 2020
- 5 Lambeth North underground station
Classic design by Leslie Green. Originally known as Kennington Road Bridge North
- 6 Imperial War Museum
Once the Bethlem Hospital. Houses an unrivalled collection of military and civilian memorabilia from WW1, WW2 and modern-day warfare
- 7 Lambeth Palace
End of the walk
