

# Guildhall Art Gallery.

## Visual Map

The following document is a visual guide through Guildhall Art Gallery and London's Roman Amphitheatre.

The document can be used by any visitor who may wish to plan their visit in more detail before they arrive.





This is the front of Guildhall Art Gallery.

To get in you will go under the third arch from the right and enter through automatic doors.

You might have to wait in line outside or inside if there is a lot of people. If you find this uncomfortable let our staff know.



These are the automatic doors to enter.



If you have a bag, you will need to put it on a tray and through a scanner. There will be a Security Officer that can help you.



Pre-booked tickets must be presented at the front / information desk.

This is also where you will find the gift shop.




Once you have shown your tickets you can choose which way to go. For this document walk towards the City Gallery and the lifts. Turn left and walk to the very end of the ground floor passing the exit on your left.



Here are the lifts that you can take to travel between the different floors.



These stairs, found by the front desk, will lead you down to the Corridor Gallery.



On this floor you can see the entrance to temporary exhibitions as well as some of the toilet facilities (accessible and gender neutral).



Next follow the stairs down (or use the lifts) and you will see the viewing window of London's Roman Amphitheatre.



Going back towards the lift and stairs you will find the Study Room which can be a quiet room, just ask one of our staff.



Next to the lift you will find the Heritage Gallery that changes its display often.



Going around you will reach an archway that will lead to the artworks displayed in the Undercroft Galleries.



There are two rooms that make up the Undercroft Galleries. The display in the Temple room (top) changes often.



These are the stairs that will lead to the Roman Amphitheatre.


To enter push the glass doors at the bottom of the stairs.



Here is London's Roman Amphitheatre. Be aware that the light is low in here and the floor might feel a bit gritty.



To see the rest of the Gallery walk through the doors and up the stairs until you are by the Entrance/Exit.



You will then see the main stairs  
(above) which will lead you to the  
Main Gallery.



The Main Gallery shows the Victorian Collection of artworks. You can view these paintings by walking around starting from your right side.



There are small steps that will lead to the balcony where a few more artworks are visible.



Once you are finished you can exit by walking down the main stairs and through the doors on your right. They are automatic. You can also go to the gift shop which is by the front / information desk.

# Final notes:

**Toilets:** We have toilets on two different floors, providing accessible toilets and one being gender neutral. For more information please visit our [website](#).

**Staff:** You will find Security Officers as well as Gallery volunteers and staff wandering around the Gallery and by the front doors.
