

- St. Martin In the Fields Religion, burials and popular culture
- The Gin Palace London's gin crazes Dutch courage to craft distilling
- Royal Courts of Justice Law in London and Britain
- Central Criminal Court Crime and punishment at Britain's highest court, the Old Bailey

- Statue of Oscar Wilde One of Britain's greatest authors with "nothing to declare but his genius
- Joe Allen Where the West End goes to dine
- St. Dunstan in the West Reform, religion and printing. First clock with a minute hand in London
- **Paternoster Square** Rebuilt after The Blitz. End of the walk

- Waldorf Hotel One of London's most famous
- Ye Olde Cheshire Cheese Meeting place for journalists and authors for hundreds of years


