- In the **Beauty** section can you find the **lilies**?

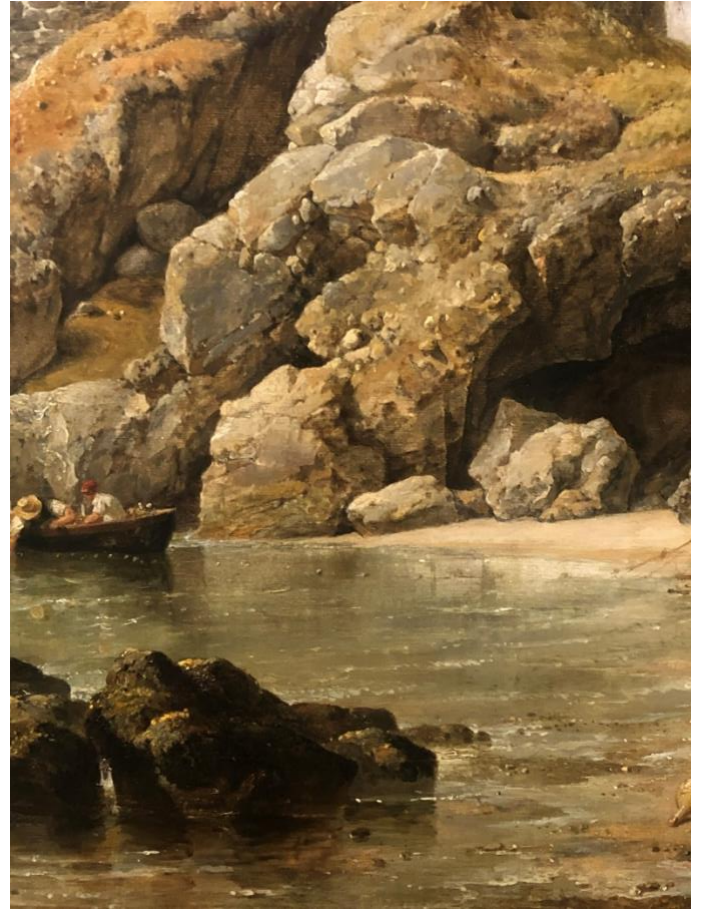


In the Victorian times people believed that flowers had special meanings. White lilies symbolised modesty and were the symbol of the Virgin Mary.

The wood the frame is made from is pine not oak, but the frame designer wanted to give the frame a natural, autumnal design.





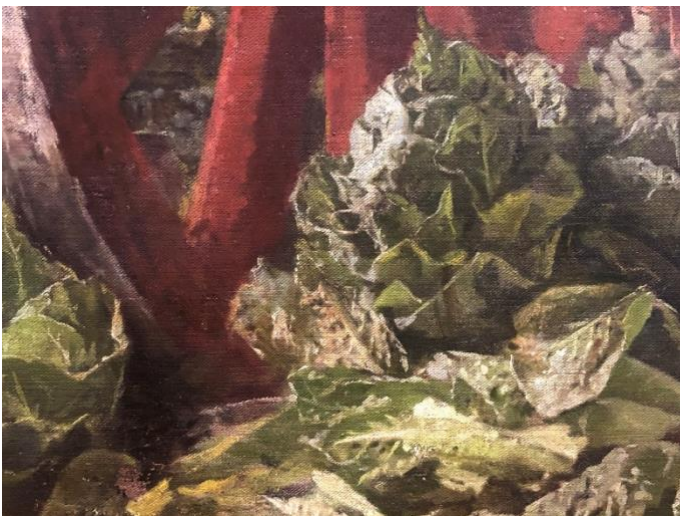
# Nature in Art Hunt
