New London Street – Experimental no vehicles restriction

The City of London (New London Street) (No. 1) Experimental Order 2019

1. NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the Common Council of the City of London on 10 January 2019 made the above experimental Order under section 9 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984.

2. The effect of the Order in **New London Street** will be to prohibit all vehicles from entering or proceeding at any time. The Order will also extend the waiting restrictions to operate 'at any time'.

3. A copy of the Order, which will come into operation on 28 January 2019, of the statement of reasons for making the Order and a plan showing the affected street can be inspected during normal office hours on Monday to Fridays inclusive within a period of 6 months from the date on which the Order came into operation at the Planning Enquiry Desk, North Wing, Guildhall, London, EC2P 2EJ.

4. Further information may be obtained from the City Transportation at the address below or by telephone 0207 332 1108.

5. The Order shall provide that, subject to the provisions of section 10(2) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, the Transportation and Public Realm Director, or some person authorised in that behalf by them, if it appears to them or that person essential:

- (a) in the interest of the expeditious, convenient and safe movement of traffic;
- (b) in the interest of providing suitable and adequate parking facilities on the highway; or
- (c) for preserving or improving the amenities of the area through which any road affected by the Order runs;

modify or suspend the Order or the provisions contained therein.

6. Any person desiring to question the validity of the Order or of any provision contained therein on the grounds that it is not within the powers of the relevant section of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, or that any of the relevant requirements thereof or of any relevant regulations made thereunder has not been complied with may, within six weeks from the date on which the Order was made, make application for the purpose to the High Court.

7. If the provisions of the Order made under section 9 continue in operation for a period of not less than six months, the Council will consider in due course whether the provisions of the Order should be reproduced and continued in force indefinitely by means of an Order made under section 6 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984. Persons desiring to object to the making of an Order under section 6 of the said Act of 1984 for the purpose of such reproduction and continuation in force may, within the afore-mentioned period of six months send a statement in writing of their objection and the grounds thereof to the Traffic Orders Officer, Department of the Built Environment, City of London, PO Box 270, Guildhall, London, EC2P 2EJ quoting the reference TraffOrder/DBE/CT-GL.
